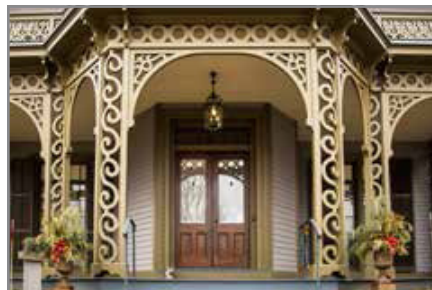


ACORN HALL

MORRISTOWN, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



Acorn Hall, in Morristown, NJ was constructed in 1853 for Dr. John Peter Schermerhorn and expanded in the 1860s by Augustus Crane. Acorn Hall exemplifies grand Italianate style architecture and has been little changed at both the interior and exterior since that time. Today Acorn Hall is home to the Morris County Historical Society.
