

BRIDGET SMITH HOUSE

MINE HILL, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Bridget Smith House, constructed circa 1855, is a one-and-one half story, duplex miner's house with a one-story rear wing on both sides of the duplex. The house is significant for its association with the prolific mining in the region and the Irish immigrants who worked in the mines. The building survives as a well-preserved vernacular iron worker's house.



- Services: Historic Preservation Plan, Contract Documents, Pre-Qualification, Bidding and Contract Administration.
- Construction: Restoration of the roof partial restoration including, structural upgrades at the roof and floor framing, and restoration of the interior plaster wall and ceiling finishes, flooring, wainscot, and doors.
- Grants: \$473,820 (Morris County Historic Preservation Trust Fund)
- Total Project Costs: \$524,310
