DR. LEWIS-CONDICT HOUSE

Dr. Lewis-Condict House is a prime example of Georgian and Federal style architecture that gained popularity among wealthier residents of the United States by the end of the eighteenth century. The house was constructed in 1797 by its first owner, Dr. Lewis Condict, a prominent citizen of Morristown. The house is considered one of the best examples of late-eighteenth-century architecture in Morristown, and today reflects the different uses it has accommodated throughout its various periods of ownership.
