

HENRY DOREMUS HOUSE

TOWACO, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



Henry Doremus House was constructed in 1760 for tanner and currier Henry Doremus. The Masonry and wood frame house was expanded upon in the early-nineteenth century to include the east wing. The house is architecturally significant as it is a rare example of a well-preserved Dutch stone residence that has been little changed since the late-nineteenth century, and is historically significant largely for its association with General George Washington, who stayed in the house from June 25-26, 1780.
