

L'ECOLE KINNELON MUSEUM

KINNELON BOROUGH, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The L'Ecole Kinnelon Museum was originally constructed in 1873 as the Meadtown Schoolhouse, and it served as a school until 1925, when it was converted into a rural vacation home know as L'Ecole. Beginning in 1930, the building was used as a weekend retreat by Dr. Helen L. Miller, a woman physician who eventually purchased the home in 1943 making it her permanent residence, and treating patients from it.
