LITTLE RED SCHOOL HOUSE



FLORHAM PARK, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Little Red Schoolhouse is a one-story brick building that was constructed in 1866 and moved to its current location in 1976. The schoolhouse is a fine example of a one-room school house that reflects typical nineteenth-century schoolhouse architecture. Today, the schoolhouse serves as a local history museum operated by the Florham Park Historical Commission.
