

METLAR/BODINE HISTORIC HOUSE MUSEUM

PISCATAWAY, MIDDLESEX COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Historic Metlar/Bodine House was constructed in three phases between 1728 and 1870. The house is architecturally and historically significant as one of two houses remaining from the Raritan Landing settlement. It is a fine example of the Greek Revival style and today serves as the repository for the historical artifacts from the Piscataway and Central New Jersey region focusing on the role of transportation in the region's development.



- Services: Including Master Plan, Conditions Assessment, Design Documents, Contract Documents, Bidding and Contract Administration.
- Construction: Multi-Phased Exterior and Interior Restoration including extensive repairs following a fire, Rehabilitation of an existing garage for accessible restrooms and support space, Restoration of the porches, roofs, siding, windows and doors, and a major expansion to house the historic Ross Hall Wall, an American Treasure.
- Total Grant Funding: \$345,000 (New Jersey Historic Trust)
- Total Project Costs: \$1.1 Million
