MURRAY FARMHOUSE

The Murray Farmhouse was originally constructed c. 1767 as the home of Joseph Murray, an Irish mason who immigrated to the American colonies around 1767 and established a farm in Middletown. Murray was killed in an act of civil aggression related to his role in a local militia during the Revolutionary War. Today owned by the Township of Middletown, The Murray Farmhouse is used for tours and educational programs.
