OSWALD NITSCHKE HOUSE



KENILWORTH, UNION COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Oswald Nitschke House is a late-19th century farmhouse and once owned by Oswald Nitschke, one of the first mayors of Kenilworth, that evolved into an early-20th century multi-family dwelling. Today home to the Kenilworth Historical Society, The Nitschke House retains much of its historic fabric and architectural integrity from its last major modification in the early-20th century.
