SEWARD HOUSE

MOUNT OLIVE TOWNSHIP, MORRIS COUNTY, NEW JERSEY





The Seward House in Mount Olive was constructed circa 1860 in two campaigns for Henry and Beulah Seward. The large stone residence with strong Italianate architectural influences at its exterior and interior detailing and its interior layout. The property remained in the Seward family until 1939. Mount Olive aquired the property in 1996 and it is part of Turkey Brook Park.
