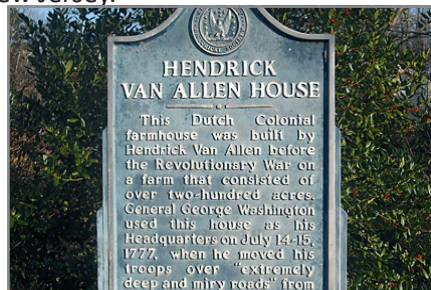


VAN ALLEN HOUSE PROPERTY

OAKLAND, BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Van Allen House was constructed circa 1748 by Hendrick Van Allen and expanded over time utilizing many of the architectural features and finishes employed by the Dutch-American cultural group in the eighteenth century. The house was located at the intersection of two important Colonial roads, which were major supply arteries during the American Revolution. Edward Day Page modified and expanded the Van Allen House in the early-twentieth century incorporating it into his larger Vygeberg Estate during a period of change in the rural landscape in northeastern New Jersey.



- Services: Historic Preservation Plan, Design and Contract Documents, Pre-Qualification, Bidding and Contract Administration.
- Construction: Multi-phase Exterior Restoration including the roof and dormers, masonry, and doors and windows; and Interior Restoration of the plaster, flooring, wood trim, doors, and improvement to first floor exhibit room.
