

VAN RIPER-HOPPER & VAN DUYNÉ HOUSES

WAYNE, PASSAIC COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



The Van Riper-Hopper and Van Duyné Houses are fine examples of Dutch-American residences constructed in the eighteenth century. The circa 1786 Van Riper-Hopper House, which is original to its site, and the pre-revolutionary Van Duyné House, which was moved to its current location in 1974, are two historic house museums that enjoy a beautiful setting adjacent to the Point View Reservoir in Wayne.
