

WATERLOO VILLAGE

BYRAM TOWNSHIP, SUSSEX COUNTY, NEW JERSEY



Waterloo Village is a historically significant site indicative of its role as a small industrial village along the Morris Canal in the nineteenth century. It is a place that thrived due to participation in the iron industry as a destination along the Morris Canal, and due to its prime location along the Musconetcong River. Much of the village remains to tell the story of the village, the workers, the role of iron in the region, local industry and commerce, and the impact of transportation on the region beginning in the 18th century when Waterloo was Andover Forge.



- Services: Preparation of a Historic Preservation Plan for twenty historic buildings at Waterloo Village including a Historical Landscape Assessment, National Register Nomination Boundary Increase and Report & Nomination.
- Total Grant Funding: \$55,000 (Morris County and New Jersey Historical Commission)
- Total Project Costs: \$192,000
- Award: New Jersey Historic Preservation Grant for National Register Nomination.
